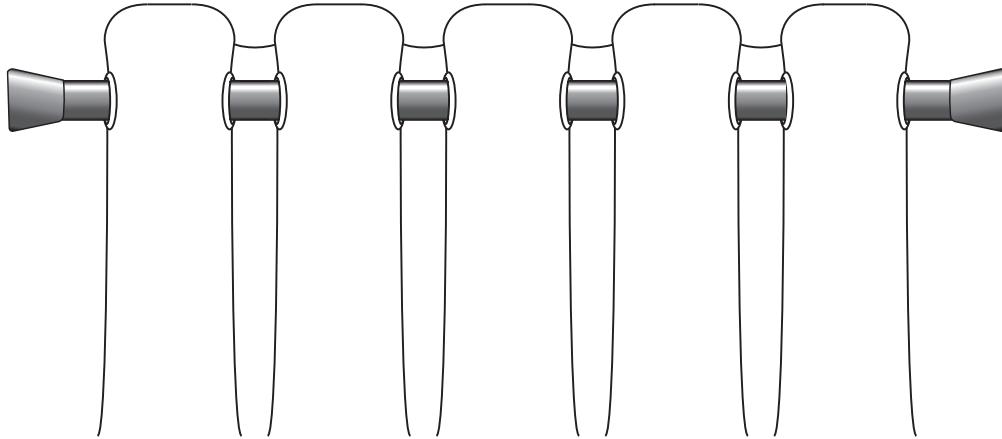


Eyelet curtains



hanging your curtains

Eyelet curtains are for poles only. No hooks or rings are required, so make sure these are removed from the pole before you begin.

Holding the curtain with the front of the fabric towards you, fold the first eyelet away from you and thread the eyelet onto the curtain pole. In order to avoid the entire curtain sliding into the middle of the window when you close the curtains, you should position this first eyelet on the outside edge of the pole bracket. This will secure the outside edge of the curtain at the end of the curtain pole.

Continue folding the eyelets towards and away from you until the entire curtain has been added to the curtain pole.

Repeat this process with the second curtain.

dressing your curtains

To achieve a professional look when hanging curtains takes time but we assure you it is worth it!

First pull the curtains back, making sure the spaces between the eyelets are even. The curtain fabric will naturally fall into pleats. Starting from the top, gently smooth each of these pleats. Then use strips of fabric to tie around the whole curtain and keep the pleats in place. Keep the curtains tied in position for as long as possible - we recommend at least 48 hours if you can. This will allow your curtains to develop distinct and even pleats.
